FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Some of you will be acquiring 2017 diaries; so, for a bit of forward thinking, please mark in 10th April, 2017, as the date for our Annual General Meeting. This is the 2nd Monday in April, because our customary 3rd Monday would have coincided with Easter Monday.

At present we are 75 full members and 8 associate, making a total of 83. Numbers have gone up considerably since the summer break; and, looking at our lists, we see that 21 have joined since July and two of these are associates. On the face of it things look very healthy; but, at the same time, we have lost some old friends for one reason or another. Thankfully, after months of trying, enquirers who seek 'Dawlish' on the National U3A website are now re-directed to our own vibrant website. Nevertheless, there are still a number of people who do not know of our existence. Do encourage people you meet to join us; or at the least get them to have a look at the website <http://u3a.dawlish.info/>.

So far as our monthly meetings go, thanks to good publicity, we generally get good attendances. Numbers vary greatly, and much depends on the perceived interest in the speaker's chosen topic; but at a recent meeting we had over 40 present (still only a fraction of our total membership). It made us wonder whether we were outgrowing our present venue, and members have also expressed an interest in alternative venues. The Committee are investigating this, but, currently, there are no easy alternatives. The best options would mean either moving to a Tuesday, or accepting a later start time than the present 2.00 pm. Let us know your views.

Most of us are now retired; and most people I meet seem to lead such busy lives - how did we ever find time to work? It is the main reason people give for not joining (or sometimes re-joining) the U3A. Because we are a small U3A most of our Interest Groups are home based. The obvious benefit is that it saves hiring costs, but it also limits the size of those Interest Groups. Some small groups flourish, but others suffer from sporadic attendances. Since we only meet once a month in most cases, may I put in a plea for commitment? Mark the U3A dates on your calendars; and, barring family/health emergencies, try to commit to them. If you are unable to attend, please out of courtesy, advise the convener accordingly.

Since the last Newsletter we have welcomed two more Interest Groups. Nine people attended the first meeting of Gadgets & Gizmos, and generated a diverse interest. Music Making has also been proposed; but a suitable date and venue have yet to be determined. Gadgets & Gizmos This recently formed Interest Group meets on the 2nd Thursday of each month from 1000 to 1200 at 6 Town Mills, Church Street, Dawlish, EX7 9QP. The scope of the subject is immense and members are invited to bring any electronic devices in which they have an interest, or any ideas on any aspect of the subject that they consider might be of collective interest. Since we have decided to divide our time between a general discussion on computing and handheld devices, essentially an airing and resolving operating principles and problems; and an hour devoted to a single technological issue.

For our meeting on 8th December Ian Enderby has offered to lead an investigation into Solar Power: both industrial and domestic.

On 12th January 2017, we anticipate that Jack Whitehead will lead us in a similar investigation of Wind Power.

If demand increases, we may have to consider either splitting the group, or changing the venue. The latter would almost certainly require a hiring fee to be recovered from the group members.
