Lateral Flow Tests

As we begin to slowly emerge from lockdown we need to be constantly vigilant of further infection. Devon's public health chief is encouraging every adult in Devon to take a rapid, lateral flow test for coronavirus twice a week to try and keep the rates of coronavirus low.

From Monday, England moves into Step 2 of our journey out of lockdown. Lateral flow tests are available, free of charge from next week. Mobile testing units will be opened from 14th April.

Locally, the following Chemists have the tests ready for collection. You will be asked a couple of questions, talked through the test and told what to do should you be unlucky enough to test positive.

I have found three pharmacies locally that are part of the scheme. There may be others.
